Philosophy for Children (P4C) has been gaining in popularity. As well as engaging pupils in posing and thinking about challenging questions, it attracts many schools seeking a coherent approach to the skills agenda and other initiatives. It provides open-ended challenge to gifted pupils within a framework that will also be enjoyed by pupils across the ability range.

This one day introductory course is based around "Pocket P4C", a user-friendly guide written by the course facilitator, gifted education specialist Jason Buckley. The day is very practical and interactive, with a wide range of resources and activity ideas, and excellent post-course support. Expected learning outcomes are:

1. Understand the thinking behind P4C and some of its benefits
2. Know how to plan and facilitate a P4C enquiry
3. Build up a store of games and activities for thinking and teamwork
4. Enjoy philosophising!

The course will be inspiring for all teachers and learning assistants, and is particularly valuable for G&T coordinators, and those with responsibility for thinking skills, pupil voice and pupil engagement. You do not need to have any prior experience of philosophy: P4C is primarily philosophy as a habit of mind rather than the traditional academic subject, although one enriches the other.

There are a maximum of 30 places in total on the course. One place on the course is **free for each London school that applies**. Further colleagues may attend for £100 + VAT each. The course will focus on KS2.

A second optional day's training to complete the **SAPERE Level 1 Certificate in P4C** will be offered on **July 15th, at £199 + VAT** per person – but the first day is designed as a basic introduction in its own right.
